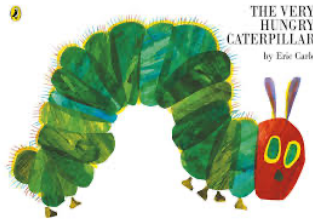

Learning Overview

Summer 1

In **Maths** we will be focusing on numbers 9, 10 and starting to explore number bonds and what addition means and adding 1 more and 1 less.

We will then start looking to 20 and beyond! We will ensure the children can consecutively count to 20 and many beyond and start thinking about looking for patterns beyond 10.



**We will have some SUPER exciting visitors join us in Class 1 this half term!! ...**

In Expressive arts and Design, we will be creating caterpillars, butterflies, life cycles and looking at still life flower art. Lots of creativity to come!

In **P.E.** we will be enjoying some team building skills during our forest school sessions on a Monday. This will see us building, exploring, observing, creating and crafting.

We will still have our Wednesday sessions with Harrogate Town too where we will be exploring rugby fundamental skills.



In **PSHE** we will be thinking about how we can show resilience in the face of a challenge and what this might look like.
