#### Geography

Can you create your own fact file on a village/town/city/country of your choice? Can you find significant landmarks of that place?

#### Learning this half term

#### <u>DT</u>

#### Mechanical Systems - Making a slingshot car

The children will be able to describe key design improvements in the history of the automobile. They will draw diagrams of different mechanical cars, create one and then assess the product against the design criteria.

#### Music

#### <u>Jazz</u>

The children will learn what ragtime music is and will compose and play a jazz motif fluently, using swung quavers.

#### **Science**

#### **Energy - Sound**

The children will be able to describe how sounds are made and how sounds are heard through different mediums. The children will also be able to explain how insulating materials can be used to muffle sound.

#### **Computing**

The children will learn why we use different

fonts and how we change them. They will learn how to write and format a News Report and will be able to write for a Campaign.

#### **PSHE**

#### Citizenship
