Our learning this half term...

Geography

The children will develop their fieldwork skills with a team enquiry, looking at road safety and littering in Beckwithshaw.

Art

The children will finish their photography project, inspired by Edward Weston, followed by exploring sculptural techniques

P.E.

On Thursday, the children will be doing outdoor orienteering with sporting influence and then on Fridays, Mrs Lyne will lead Rounders lessons.

Music

We will study Theme and Variation as well as working hard towards the Beckwithshaw production of, 'The Wizard of Oz.'

<u>Maths</u>

Maths for Year 6 will involve problem solving including, 'Who dunnit?' Murder Mystery investigations. Year 5 will recap their Place Value and Number work to ensure, 'Ready to Progress' as well as completing Converting Units and Time work

<u>PSHE</u>

In PSHE, our unit about Safety and the Changing Body will cover puberty, including emotional and physical changes. Later in the term, we will discuss transition to a new class or new school.

French

We will study, 'Visiting a French town' and learn to develop our conversational skills now that we know more French verbs

Computing

In Computing, the children will study Networks with Mr Newland.

Science

Circulation and health -Much of our work with link with English outcomes

RE

What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today? We will explore key beliefs, prayer, charity and special places.

English

We will be reading Pig Heart Boy by Malorie
Blackman which will lead to exciting story writing.
Alongside, we will ensure we are confident with
