Children are to complete the following homework each week:

- Year 5- Activity in homework book for reading and maths
- All children:

- Weekly spelling shed online games please (login is in your child's homework book). The spelling shed words are
  tested weekly via quizzes and games rather than a formal test so please ensure your child engages with this work
  as records are kept of their progress which feeds into their writing assessment judgements.
- Times Table Rockstars and reading
- Year 6- Please only complete the allocated amounts from the CGP book due to it being aligned with class work.

Your child will be given a new homework book. This is where any homework for Year 5 is to be completed and statutory spelling work and any additional tasks for both year groups. Below, there is topic-based homework that can be completed over the half term to deepen and extend knowledge learnt in school in the wider curriculum subjects. This needs to be handed in on Seesaw / blue homework book / emailed to admin by **Monday 21**<sup>st</sup> **October**. This will enable us to share the children's wonderful work at the end of the half term.

Make a French book for younger children, showing them how to translate key words and phrases you have learnt. Sign up to the Duolingo App.

Find out more about working conditions in Victorian times. Choose how you would like to present your findings.

Design and make/sew an outfit for a cuddly toy you have at home, using your knowledge and skills from our textiles lessons.

# Our learning this half term...

### **History**

In History, we will study census records and particularly focus on the life of Mary Bucktrout, a Leeds girl who worked in the textile mills during Victorian times, linking to our English biography

#### DT

The textiles unit will link to our history work about Victorian times as we design, make, assemble and decorate a waistcoat design for a child from this era.

# P.E.

In P.E, we will begin by working on our football skills with Tuesday sessions being led by Mrs Lyne. On Thursdays with Sporting Influence, we will play Hockey games and work on the skills involved in this sport.

#### Music

We will listen to and sing music from South and West Africa as well as engaging in drumming and percussion instrumental sessions and learning chord progressions.

## Maths

Maths will begin with a study of place value, using practical resources, followed by a unit on the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

## **PSHE**

In PSHE, we will be exploring the theme, 'Families and relationships,' thinking about respect, boundaries, differences, trust and healthy relationships face to face and online.

## **French**

In French, we will develop our speaking and listening skills. Our unit entitled, 'Transport' will involve us explaining how we travel to school.

## Computing

In Computing, we will begin with a unit on 'Coding.'
