Reading - At least 10 minutes Daily

Reading every day and written in children's reading record. This can be a coloured banded book or a reading for pleasure book from home.

Statutory Spellings - 2x per week

Please find the lists sent out to be practised in Homework books. These are statutory spellings for the age group (Y3 or Y4) and need to be learnt off by heart by the end of the academic year.

TTRS or Edshed - 10 minutes Daily





Learning this half term

R.E

In R.E the children will continue to explore the question: What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?

Science

Animal classification and changing habitats (continued)

The children will continue to group animals in various ways, including vertebrates (mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish) and invertebrates.

They will also group plants in various ways, including flowering and non-flowering plants. They will investigate how humans and natural disasters happen.

Geography

What are rivers and how are they used?

The children will explain the water cycle, how a river is formed, where we can find rivers, how rivers are used and learn more about the features of our local river.

French

Fabulous French Food

The children will learn the names for items of food and use their number skills to calculate amounts of money in French .

Computing

Animation

Children will decide what makes a good animated film or cartoon and discuss their favourites.

They will learn what 'stop motion' animation is and use this to create their own animations!

Music

Changes in Pitch, tempo and dynamics (Theme – Rivers)

The children will explain how a piece of music makes them feel using some musical terminology, create, write and perform a vocal ostinato in time.

Art

Craft and design - Fabric of nature

The children will create drawings that replicate a selected image. We will then create a pattern using their drawing, taking inspiration from mood boards and initial research to develop it.

PSHE

Changing body and Transition

Year 3 will learn about First Aid and the role they can take in emergency situations. They will also learn about road safety and will create goals to achieve in Year 4.

Year 4 will learn about puberty and the physical differences between a child and an adult and will recognise that change is a part of growing up and the strategies we can use to cope with this.

Maths

The children will be learning about fractions, decimals, percentages and statistics.

English

We will use a range of texts and sources to support us this half term. Using these, the children will write a biography, a narrative and a non-chronological report.
