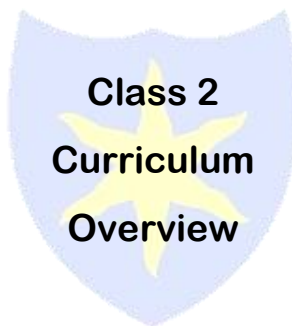
Electric systems
