Learning this half term

<u>R.E</u>

In R.E the children will be exploring the theme: **'What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?'** They will be focusing on making connections between Muslim practice of the Five Pillars and their beliefs about God and the Prophet Muhammad. Describing and reflecting on the significance of the Holy Qur'an to Muslims. Describing the forms of guidance a Muslim uses and compare them to forms of guidance experienced by the pupils. Make connections between the key functions of the mosque and the beliefs of Muslims.

<u>Science</u>

Circulation & Health

The children will learn to recognise factors that affect our health, identify the key roles of blood, understand the relationship between animal size and heart rate, understand the relationship between exercise and heart rate and describe the relationship between heart rate and fitness.

Geography

Can I carry out an independent fieldwork enquiry?

The children will be observing, measuring, recording and presenting their own fieldwork study in the local area.

Children will explore the theme of 'Theme and Variations' and discover how rythms can 'translate' onto different instruments.

In this unit the children will explore the differences between the World Wide Web and the internet, find out what a LAN and WAN are and how access the internet at school, research and find out about the age of the internet and think about what the future might hold.

The children will be creating a personal memory box using a collection of found objects and hand sculptured forms and reflecting on their primary school life.

Visiting a town in France

The children will be learning to:

Name places in a town. Follow simple directions accurately. Describe the relationship between places using a preposition. Role-play buying tickets in. Construct, negative sentences correctly. Use a writing frame to give a reasoned

opinion for visiting a place. Identify the grammatical elements of a text. Understand the gist of a text. Use a text to write their own description of a place.

<u>Math's</u>

The children will be consolidating previous learning as well as exploring themes such as budgeting, scaling and time.

<u>English</u>

The children will be looking at a variety of fiction, non-fiction texts as well as poems and use these as a stimulus to write a story, an information report and a campaign.
