
We really appreciate the time taken to support your child at home and can really see the difference it makes to your child's progress.

Children are to complete the following homework **each week**:

- Year 6- Weekly reading comprehension, SPAG and maths from the CGP book (complete allocated work only).
- Year 5- Activity in homework book for reading and maths
- All children:

- Weekly spelling shed online games please (login is in your child's homework book). The spelling shed words are tested weekly via quizzes and games rather than a formal test so please ensure your child engages with this work as records are kept of their progress which feeds into their writing assessment judgements.

- Year 6- Please only complete the allocated amounts from the CGP book due to it being aligned with class work.

Below, there is topic-based homework that can be completed over the half term to deepen and extend knowledge learnt in school in the wider curriculum subjects. Our learning this half term...

<u>History</u>

In History, we will describe the features of ancient Greece, including researching Greek gods and goddesses and making inferences about them. We will explain how the Athenian democracy worked and identify the achievements of the ancient Greek philosophers.

<u>Art</u>

The Art work will be based around Hockney. We will produce pieces of work for an exhibition at Ripley Castle which is hugely exciting.

<u>P.E.</u>

On Mondays, we will be swimming and on Thursdays, the children will do netball with sporting influence.

Music

We will create compositions based around the festival of 'Holi.' The children will engage in vocal and compositions and perform as a group.

<u>Maths</u>

Maths will begin with a recall of the long division method followed by working on fractions, decimals and percentages as well as Area and Perimeter.

<u>PSHE</u>

In PSHE, we will understand that there are different routes into careers as we look at a range of jobs pupils can do. We will understand what income and expenditure are and how these can be recorded.

<u>French</u>

In French, we will ask and answer questions about houses and rooms. We will use a writing frame to create a written description of a house and write a letter to describe rooms in a house, using prepositions.

Computing

In Computing, the children will study spreadsheets with Miss Miller.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, the children will be exploring variation and inheritance in different living things and how fossil evidence has led to the theory of evolution.

<u>RE</u>

The children will discuss and think about what religious and nonreligious worldviews teach about caring for the Earth.

English

We will be reading, 'Rooftoppers' by Katherine Rundell.

Growing up with her guardian, Charles, Sophie is convinced that her mother is still alive and sets out to find her. Sophie's search takes her to the rooftops of Paris where she learns about identity, hope and courage.

Our writing outcomes involve: newspaper reports, setting descriptions, diaries and narrative openings.
