
Homework

Children are to complete the following homework each week:

- Year 6- Weekly reading comprehension, SPAG and maths from the CGP book (complete allocated work only).
- Year 5- Activity in homework book for reading and maths
- All children:
- Statutory spelling words-tested at the end of each half term (words will be stuck in blue homework book)
- Weekly spelling shed online games please (login is in your child's homework book). The spelling shed words are tested weekly via quizzes and games rather than a formal test so please ensure your child engages with this work as records are kept of their progress which feeds into their writing assessment judgements.
- Times Table Rockstars and reading
- Year 6- Please only complete the allocated amounts from the CGP book due to it being aligned with class work.

Your child was given a pink homework book. This is where any homework for Year 5 is to be completed and statutory spelling work and any additional tasks for both year groups. Below, there is topic-based homework that can be completed over the half term to deepen and extend knowledge learnt in school in the wider curriculum subjects. Our learning this half term...

<u>Geography</u>

In Geography, our question asked is, 'Why do oceans matter?' We study the water cycle and the Great Barrier Reef, looking at how humans impact the oceans and the consequences of this.

<u>Art/DT</u>

The Art work will be completed for Ripley Castle exhibition and then we will move on to some DT work about structures and playgrounds.

<u>P.E.</u>

On Mondays, we will be swimming and on Thursdays, the children will do Tag Rugby with Sporting Influence

Music

We will create compositions, using our looping and remixing skills.

<u>Maths</u>

Maths will be a study of Percentages followed by Ratio and Proportion as well as Algebra and Shape work

PSHE

In PSHE, we will think about Citizenship and understanding the law including challenging prejudice and discrimination, parliament and national democracy

French

In French, children will continue to develop their speaking and listening skills as they study French music celebrations.

Computing

In Computing, the children will study, 'Blogging' and continue their weekly Seesaw blog.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, the children will be looking at Circuits, batteries and switches.

<u>RE</u>

The children will work with Mrs Bassitt to study Salvation and the Easter Story.

English

We will be reading Malamander by Thomas Taylor and engaging in class debates, learning how to write balanced arguments and story openings as well as persuasive adverts/letters. We will work hard with our reading skills, developing more detailed explanations when answering comprehension questions. On World Book Day, we will study famous historical speeches.
