CLASS 1

Another lovely start to Autumn 2 in Class One. We have been busy in our English looking at a variety of texts on our topic 'toys'. We practised writing Character Descriptions about Dogger using adjectives to form expanded noun phrases and we very much enjoyed looking at the song Teddy Bear's Picnic, writing a recount of our own exciting Teddy Bear's Picnic! We thoroughly enjoyed the Teddy Bear's Picnic, lots of smiles and some very impressive dance moves!!

In Maths, we have been working hard on our addition and subtraction and gaining independence in using our maths resources. We have explored number bonds to 10/20 and tackled near doubles with resilience and determination.

Our wider curriculum has seen us exploring toys of the past in our history and thinking about how and why toys have changed. The children have enjoyed a show and tell session with their favourite toys and are so excited to start creating Baby Bear's chair in DT in the coming weeks. We are enjoying exploring the Christian Christmas story in R.E which is helping us to understand our own parts in the Nativity.

We are working so hard to learn the songs and our lines for our Nativity play and there's lots of exciting discussions between the children about costumes!

We have been comparing materials in science and have been investigating why materials are chosen for particular objects. We are looking forward to investigating how materials can be changed using 'stretch it, bend it, twist it, squash it'.

Our little Reception starters featured in the Harrogate Advertiser. Little superstars!

Class One continue to show such enthusiasm for their learning, and I look forward to seeing this continue.

Class 2

We have had a really great start to the second half term of the school year in Class 2.

We have been studying Antarctica in Geography and using it as inspiration in English so as the weather has got colder we have had lots of snowy, frozen stories and polar facts.

Our class book is a fictionalised account of the childhood of Mathew Henson a black Polar explorer who only found the same recognition as his white companions' years after his expeditions.

In English we have focused on describing Antarctica and how to set a scene when writing.

We have held some really successful joint spelling and writing workshops with class 3 where the children have had buddies from the class above to model good practise for them.

Our new Science topic is electrical circuits and the children have really enjoyed building circuits and testing them to see if they can make a component work. We have learned about switches and power sources and insulators and conductors so far.

In Maths we have learned (or recapped for year 4) the column addition method and are now focusing on subtraction.

I have really enjoyed seeing the children take on the challenge of gymnastics in the hall, they have been very enthusiastic and all have tried really hard to master the moves that Mrs Wilcox from Sporting Influence has shown them. We have been using our yoga sessions as a chance to relax our bodies and our minds and have done some breathing work to help mental wellbeing alongside the physical benefits of yoga.

We were lucky enough to join a webinar with the CEO of Octopus energy where we discussed renewable energy sources and were able to ask questions of our own.

Our RE has involved discussions and learning about religious festivals and how they are celebrated, with Christmas approaching we are going to compare this to other festivals from different religions. In PSHE we have explored how to look after our own health and wellbeing, so far we have looked at diet and dental care and will be looking at techniques we can use to boost our emotional health as the term progresses.

We have all enjoyed expressing ourselves artistically where we have learned about how to use tints and shades of colours to create 3D effects.

What a wonderful half term so far in Class 3! Your children are making amazing progress with their writing as we enjoy our texts, 'No Ballet Shoes in Syria' and 'Boy at the Back of the Class.'


We have written emotive diary entries and really improved our technical accuracy and vocabulary choices as well as ensuring we check spellings with care when editing.

Anti-bullying week was fun as we composed songs in Music with the theme of, 'Choose respect.' These were excellent and really put across the important message of treating others how you would like to be treated.

The children have been 'independent enquirers' in Science as they investigate light and reflections and study the eye. This led to some great discussion in PSHE about quality of sleep and how we can ensure we get plenty of rest each night.

Our Maths work has involved mastery of fractions and we are improving every day. Time has been taken to ensure the children are fluent with many of them enjoying the daily challenges of reasoning and problem solving.

The boys in the photograph are proud of their RE work which investigates how religious and non-religious worldviews are celebrated through festivals, looking at different reasons people celebrate.

TOYS SAFETY

In the lead up to Christmas, when your children will be receiving toys, electronics and gifts, we want to highlight the dangers of button batteries and magnets that are found in many of these items, as well as general household objects. Below is some information to help you identify dangers and what to do if your child ingests a battery or magnet.


BREAKING NEWS

Magnets can rip a hole in your child's gut!



- Super strong magnets, like these, can cause serious damage to your child's insides if they swallow them.
- They can join together and make holes in their gut. Removal can be difficult and need complex surgery.





 They can be in toys, jewellery, fridge magnets or cheap products bought from online marketplaces. They can be 10 times stronger than is safe.

🗥 If your child may have swallowed magnets, don't delay! 🗥 Call 999 for an ambulance or go straight to A&E. Symptoms can seem like a stomach bug or appendicitis.

BUTTON CELL BATTERIES

WHAT ARE THE DANGERS?



When a button cell battery reacts with saliva it creates caustic soda, the chemical used to unblock drains.

Even after the batteries appear to have 'died' they still have enough power to create a reaction. If swallowed, the batteries can get stuck in a child's throat and burn the flesh, injuring or even killing them.

WHERE WILL I FIND THEM?

TOYS & GADGETS


Novelty toys such as robot bug or fish toys, fidget spinners with LED lights and gaming headsets.

HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

Bathroom and kitchen scales, thermometers, night lights, calculators, tea lights and spare battery drawers.

REMOTES & WATCHES

Remote controls, car key fobs and key finders, fitness trackers, watches, 3D glasses and musical greetings cards.




Button cell batteries are dangerous. Check your home for them.

Safeguarding



Button batteries – where are yours?

Button batteries, particularly big, powerful lithium coin cell batteries, can badly hurt or kill a small child within two hours, if they get stuck in the food pipe. Know where yours are, so you can keep your children safe.

- Hunt around your home for button batteries in products as well as spare and 'flat' batteries.
- Keep products well out of children's reach if the battery compartment isn't secured.
- Store spare button batteries in sealed containers in a high cupboard.
- Remember that 'flat' or 'dead' batteries still hold enough power to badly hurt a child. So put them out of children's reach straight away and recycle them safely and as quickly as possible.
- If you think your child has swallowed one, don't delay. Trust your instincts and take them to A&E straight away or call 999 for an ambulance. Don't let them eat or drink and don't make them sick
