Design a new toy of your choice and label it. Do some research to see if you can find a gap in the market for something new.

your research. Can you name all of

South America?

Carry out a scientific experiment involving a reversible or an irreversible change. Seek permission from parents first. Do you know the difference between the two changes?

Homework Ideas

Design your own poster advertising a toy of your choice.
Don't forget to use persuasive features to advertise.

Re-design a book cover for our class story, 'Freedom Bird.'

Write a persuasive speech on a topic you feel strongly about.
What changes would you like to see? How will you persuade your audience to share your viewpoint?

Recount our visit to the pantomime, picking out the key parts which made our trip to see a live performance so mesmerising.
Bring this to share on red carpet with your peers.

Write a recipe for a healthy lifestyle, using your knowledge from PSHE lessons. Can you include the 10 keys to a happier lifestyle too?

Our learning this half term

Geography

In Geography, we will look at life in the Andes which will include an exploration of South America through the reading of, 'The boy who biked the world' as well as studying human and physical features of Cusco, Peru.

DT involves researching current toys and then creating an electrical hand held game, following on from the research completed, including the design, make and evaluate process.

Science

In Science this half term we will be looking at the hardness of materials, their transparency and conductivity as well as describing reversible and irreversible changes.

Music

Our focus in Music this half term will be appraising musical features in a variety of film contexts and using graphic scores to convey emotions and relating to film music. We will complete the sponsored sing in December.

Maths

In Year 4 we will continue to learn our times tables by rote and ensure children master the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Year 5 and 6 children will move on to studying fractions and decimals as well as more challenge through their multiplication and division work.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be exploring health and wellbeing and lifestyles. We will plan long term goals and understand the impact of technology on mental health and physical wellbeing as well as understanding ways to prevent illness and how habits can be good or bad for our health

French

In French, we will ask and respond to questions about food and perform a short story using words and actions as we complete the unit, 'Gourmet tour of France.'

Computing

In Computing, Mrs Foster will be exploring online safety wit the children so they gain a greater understanding of the impact that sharing digital content can have as well as being aware of appropriate and inappropriate sharing of photos and videos online.

P.E.

In P.E, we will be focussing on athletics.
This will give us many opportunities to
practice our running, throwing, jumping and
catching skills.

We will also play Handball during our Friday sessions.

English

We are continuing the theme of friendship/bullying/diversity by reading
Cloudbusting by Valerie Blackman and Do you speak
Chocolate? (Y6) by Cas Lester. Following this, our focus will be on Freedom Bird Jerdine Nolen.
