Reading - At least 10 minutes Daily

Spelling

Learning this half term

R.E

How should we care for others in the world?

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from different religious and spiritual ways of life about caring for other people and for the world. Pupils learn about how beliefs turn into actions for many religious and non-religious people.

Science

Energy: Light and Shadows

The children will explore light source and how light reflects on different surfaces. The children will investigate materials that cast shadows and how shadows change depending on the time of day or the distance from the light source.

History

Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age

During this topic the children will research the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. From this they will explain which period they would prefer to have lived in, providing evidence for their choice.

English

In English we will be reading Planet Omar. Over the Autumn term the children will be working on writing instruction, a diary and a character description.

French

French Greetings

The children will learn to greet each other in French and introduce themselves. They will learn to ask and answer questions about felling in French.

Computing

Coding

The children will explore a variety of tools, games, and activities to support learning. Coding is particularly engaging, as it introduces programming concepts in a fun and accessible way for young learners.

Music

Ballads

The children will learn that Ballads are songs which tell a story. They can be in many styles, such as pop, musical theatre and were used in ancient times to carry news and legends across countries.

<u>Art</u>

Prehistoric Paintings

The children will explore prehistoric art, recreating the style of cave artists using charcoal and natural pigments. Pupils experiment with colour mixing, and creating large-scale artworks, enhancing both artistic skills and historical knowledge.
