Learning this half term



In <u>Science</u>, we will be looking at plant growth. We will be exploring what seeds need to grow, identify stages of a plant life cycle, effects of sunlight on plants. We will of course be growing various plants, flowers, fruits and vegetables!

In <u>PSHE</u>, we will be starting to look at safety and the changing body. This will see us thinking about safety for ourselves with trusted adults, appropriate touch, private parts are private and respecting personal boundaries.

In <u>R.E.</u> we will be learning about what it means to be part of a faith community. We will be looking deeper into Christianity and Judaism, comparing wedding celebrations and thinking about the symbols of belonging for both religions.



In <u>Art</u>, we will be looking at making secondary colours and using different painting tools to create texture. We will be looking at creating a collage inspired by 'Romare Beardon'.

> In <u>Music</u>, we will be exploring how to start reading music, clapping to rhythms and thinking about structure with rhythmic patterns.

In P.E, we will be practising our athletic skills ahead of Sports Day! We will be exploring team work as well as striving independently in throwing, jumping, catching and running.

In <u>Geography</u>, we will be thinking about whether we would prefer to live in a hot or cold place. We will be exploring the continents across the world and comparing the UK with a much hotter country!





In <u>Computing</u> we will be exploring how to make music using technology. We will also be looking at where technology is used outside the classroom, including away from laptops and iPad.

In <u>Maths</u> we will be learning to understand the value of money, using both coins and notes. We will compare values and calculate using money.

We will then be looking at statistics and understanding how to interpret data from tally charts, tables and bar charts as well as creating some of our own.
