#### Class 1

Class One are showing such maturity and independence towards their learning this half term. We have started our new topic looking at growing plants/flowers and the children were super engaged in a fantastic school trip to Harlow Carr last week. We looked at how different plants and flowers grew around the gardens and planted our own flowers, as well as finding time to have a play in the park of course. We have supported our learning in science by looking at what plants and flowers need to thrive, and we cannot wait to start planting some more flowers around the school grounds.

Year 1 have been working so hard to understand how to count in 2s and 10s and have even challenged their learning and understanding further by starting their times tables!! The children have been so enthusiastic about writing their instructions for English and cannot wait to follow their own instructions to make their cress heads. We were fantastic in naming some different famous monuments around the world in our geography learning, with some wonderful singing for our 7 continents song. We are so looking forward to learning the 5 oceans of the world.

Reception have been busy looking at 3D shapes and discussing what makes a shape 2D or 3D. The children are building on their communication and language skills daily and accessing provision to build their social skills further. We thoroughly enjoyed time on the trikes and scooters and are looking forward to commencing Forest School next week. We will also be extending our learning further to look at other growing elements in the world around us, including investigating some different fruits and vegetables. All whilst we keep practising our letter formation and building sentences in our writing.

We also welcomed 5 new visitors to our classroom. The children have named our caterpillars and there is so much excitement every morning to see if they have moved into their next stage of metamorphosis. The caterpillars are about ready to create their chrysalises.

Miss Miller is so impressed with how hard we are all working and just how positive our growth mindset is to tackle challenges in Class One.




#### Class 3

#### Class 4



In RE, Class 4 recalled their knowledge about Hinduism from earlier in the year and made connections with the new question, 'What is it like to be a Hindu in Britain today?' This has captured the interest of many and some great 'awe and wonder' questions were posed.

PSHE lessons have explored looking after our mental health and well-being and the children discussed challenges for some with this and support systems that could be put in place. We are such a great team in Class 4 and the children have truly embodied our values of community, compassion and courage this term in class and with their work within the wider school community including the bake sale and Royal Hall rehearsals and performance.
