REMINDERS, UPDATES AND INFORMATION

WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS MONTH

Class 1:

What a busy, yet fantastic start back for Class One this half term!

Our English takes us exploring the Kahali desert with Sunny the meerkat, engaging in our exciting setting description writing activities linked to Meerkat Mail. We will be comparing this setting to Beckwithshaw and carefully observing the differences.

We have been working hard in our maths, covering Addition and Subtraction using number lines and progressing to Place Value (within 50) looking at some much bigger numbers! Reception having been 'Growing 6, 7 and 8' using maths resources to support our learning and learning how to combine groups to introduce part-part whole structures.

Miss Miller has also been so impressed with our discussions on how animals can be categorised in our Science lessons and what makes animals similar and different.

In Music, we are using our bodies to explore the rhythm and pulse for different pieces of music, Toy Story was a huge hit!

In R.E we have started to think about what means to belong and we have been looking at sym-







bols of belonging for the Christian religion.

We are working super hard on our handwriting and letter formation, and we continue to thrive and enjoy phonics each day.

We have a classroom full of enthusiasm and smiles!



WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS MONTH

Class 2:

This half term Class 2 have started exploring their topic of the rainforest. We have been exploring biomes and identifying the environment of rainforests across the world.

Class 2 really enjoyed their trip to the Leeds Art Gallery linked to their art topic. We had the chance to sketch what we saw and think about detail and experiment using the correct art vocabulary. We saw lots of different sculptures, paintings, photographs and abstract pieces that made us think.

We have had a visit from Dogs Trust, which all children really enjoyed. We learnt about other people's animals or pets and how to respect these animals like we would respect other human beings.

Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed last half term being able to take part in the KS2 Dance Festival and coming away with two awards certificates overall. Year 2 are excited for their chance to do just as well this half term.







WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS MONTH

Class 3 have started the new half term at full throttle! We had an amazing trip to Leeds City Museum where we learnt all about Nesyamun the 3,000 year-old mummy. We even turned our hand to complete a mummification...beware!







Our topic this half term is a geography unit – 'Why are Rainforests important to us.' We can't wait to get started.


In science we are looking at living things with a focus on life cycles. We have taken delivery of our eggs and incubator and are eggstremely eggcited for the hatching to begin!
