HEADTEACHER UPDATE

Dear Parent and Carers,

As we come towards the end of the Spring Term I would like to share some wonderful highlights with you and reflect on what has been another, outstanding term.

Children have experienced a wealth or enrichment activities: Railway Museum, Leeds City Museum, Leeds City Art Gallery, Zoom calls with NASA Astronauts, Zoom calls with famous authors and illustrators, life-saving Mini-Medics, chicks, dance competitions, Easter bonnet parades and much more! These valuable experiences lift our curriculum off the paper and give your children the most memorable life experiences. You can follow all our activities on our social media accounts.

In addition to the above, we have again been successful with gaining awards: all schools receiving national attendance awards -Beckwithshaw and Ripley in the top 25% and Kettlesing in the top 10%! Kettlesing and Beckwithshaw have also been shortlisted for the Service Children's Friendly School Award 2024 (we find out on 22.03) and the Kettlesingers sang beautifully in the Harrogate Competitive Music Festival 2024. As you can see, even though a short term, we have done so much!

Thank you so much to all those who filled in our Spring Term Questionnaire, as you will see from the above, trips, visits, clubs, staffing, and experiences post pandemic were key points raised from Autumn along with help for homework to support yourselves and increased communication channels. The questionnaires are a super way for us to support you and to action your ideas and thoughts. Thank you so much for all the wonderful responses to this term's. Highlights being that your children are telling you all about their learning when they get home; communication continues to be much improved; staffing is settled and children learning well; your children have access to more clubs and trips and the competitions they now take part in build that team spirit . 100% feel their child is kept safe at school; that your child does well in school and that 'staff are working well together and are happy and fulfilled in their job. They all know the children even if they are not in their class.' All these comments really do shine through.

Of course, there are always things for us to reflect on and this is why we hugely value not only termly questionnaires but the conversations we have with you. The feedback regarding teacher/TA support if staff are redeployed for behaviour support; increased usage of school fields, even more whole federation events; FORS, FOBS and FOKS targeted fundraising; cooking and baking (life skills) and even more clubs on offer will all be discussion points as we transition after Easter from an IEB to a Full Governing body: another hugely exciting and positive move forward for our federation.

I continue to be proud of all stakeholders and to lead this wonderfully successful federation of schools - I know you are too as 100% of those who completed the questionnaire felt proud that their child attends our federation. How delightful!

WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS MONTH

Class 1:

What a term we've had in Class One!

We've been so lucky to have so many amazing learning activities over the last few weeks and these have created so much positive development for each of the children and for us as a class.

Science week seen us enjoying Owl Adventures where we all got to hold an owl and learn about their habitat and lifestyle. We visited farming live to see a morning in the life of a farmer and got to see some newly born lambs and we have continued our work on comparing animals, whilst supporting Class 4 with their chicks.

Our writing continues to grow, not only in English, but across the wider curriculum. We have been working hard to produce some fantastic setting descriptions of the Kalahari Desert and are currently creating postcards to send to Sunny the Meerkat!

We have developed our understanding in PSHE of what it means to be healthy and how this is not only physical but mental also. We now know that exercise, diet, sleep and wellbeing all contribute to keeping ourselves healthy and happy.

We continue to challenge ourselves daily with phonics and our progress and success is most definitely showing in our reading and writing. Miss Miller is so impressed with the work ethic and behaviour standards we have maintained, and our class results and the work produced are showing just how much effort we are putting into our learning!

It has been a pleasure to spend my first term with Class One and I simply cannot wait for all the exciting activities to commence in Summer We have another half term of enriched learning to come...















Class 2:

Class 2 have been working really hard since February half term. We have learnt lots of new things and truly enjoyed the hands-on learning that has come with British Science Week.

During British Science Week, we got to meet lots of different types of owls and a Harris Hawk; which were incredible.

We also got the chance to meet and hold our school chicks Wiggles and Rhubarb.

Finally, we finished British Science Week with a virtual NFU farming experience where we were taken through the job of a farm vet.

Year 3 have learnt a lot this term during their first-time swimming with KS2.

KS1 Dance Competition -Year 2 did Mrs Sabet, Miss Povey and Miss Miller proud. They performed and behaved beautifully.

We loved having Owl Adventures back this time with snakes, spiders and a bearded dragon. Lots of the children were so brave to hold the carpet python.

We cannot wait for all the exciting things planned for the Summer term.















Class 3:

I can't believe we're in the final week of the spring term, with just one more term left – where has the time gone?

This half term Class 3 have been very focused on science.

We have had a brilliant 'time' celebrating British Science Week.

We have designed our own farms of the future, entered the British Science Week poster competition, had Owl Adventures come in to show us some birds of prey and reptiles, looked at life cycles of mammals, plants, birds, insects and amphibians and there is more to come!

We have mini medics soon and Sublime Science coming in to have a day filled with crazy science experiments.













Class 4:

Class 4 have loved having the chicks here at Beckwithshaw and whilst we were sad for them to leave, we know that both Rhubarb and Wiggles will be happy back on the farm and reunited with Yolky and Fizzy who are thriving.

It was fabulous to witness new life right before our eyes, linking in with our learning about the life cycles of birds, amphibians, mammals and insects, making observations and comparisons.

During British Science week, we looked specifically at how these animals change over time and we were interested to link our work with the rainforest animals too, finding out more about how macaws are vulnerable creatures and how important it is to protect our rainforest for a brighter future. It was thoroughly interesting and enjoyable to have owls and reptiles in our school building for first hand observation...

The RE work this half term was all about Easter and it allowed us to use our art skills to portray the events of Holy Week. We were invited to the church for Easter stories too which was a lovely community event.

Our Flute Stars group are enjoying learning on Tuesdays with the federation choir busy rehearsing for the Royal Hall performance. The Ready Steady Sing group will be performing for our parents and carers on Friday 3rd May during Celebration Assembly in the Village Hall.

Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence.


