Learning this half term

<u>R.E</u>

In R.E the children will be exploring the theme:

'What does it mean to be a Muslim in
Britain today?' They will be focusing on
making connections between Muslim practice of
the Five Pillars and their beliefs about God and the
Prophet Muhammad. Describing and reflecting on
the significance of the Holy Qur'an to Muslims.
Describing the forms of guidance a Muslim uses
and compare them to forms of guidance
experienced by the pupils. Make connections
between the key functions of the mosque and the
beliefs of Muslims.

Music

Musical Theatre

The children will be learning about the history of musical theatre. Identifying character songs and action songs. Create a musical theatre scene and rehearse and perform a musical theatre scene.

Computing

Text Adventures

The children will be using 2connect to plan a 'Choose your own text adventure' type story. They will use 2Connect plans for a story adventure to make the adventure using 2Create a Story. They will learn to read and understand given code for a text adventure game. As well as debug a text adventure and independently create and implement improvements.

<u>Science</u>

Circulation & Health

The children will learn to recognise factors that affect our health, identify the key roles of blood, understand the relationship between animal size and heart rate, understand the relationship between exercise and heart rate and describe the relationship between heart rate and fitness.

<u>History</u>

Who should go on the banknote?

The children will learn to explain the significance of people on banknotes.

Decide whether a person is historically significant. Evaluate the significance of historical figures. Explain the significance of William Tuke. Explain the significance of Mary Seacole. Evaluate the significance of sporting people. Evaluate the significance of historical figures.

Recognise that verbs take different forms and to find infinitive verbs in a dictionary. Know that some verbs do not follow regular patterns. Build and deliver a short presentation, choosing and using a range of action verbs.

English

The children will be exploring the book 'Can you see me?' and using this to write a diary, autobiography and a balanced argument.

Math's

In Math's the children will be focusing on: Shape, Position and Direction, Statistics and the Four Operations.
