Our learning this half term...

Geography

The children will develop their understanding of deserts, looking at biomes and the Mojave Desert, including benefits, threats and drawbacks to living in a desert.

DT

The children will participate in a 'Come dine with me!' experience where they will plan some delicious recipes and even have some time to cook them.

P.E.

On Thursday, the children will be doing Rounders and on Fridays, the children will practise for sports day and engage in dance work for the production.

Music

We will learn World War 2 songs and continue to explore this engaging topic through our music work.

Maths

Maths for Year 6 will involve problem solving including, 'Who dunnit?' Murder Mystery investigations. Year 5 will recap their Place Value and Number work to ensure, 'Ready to Progress' and Year 4- Decimals, Money, Shape and Statistics.

PSHE

In PSHE, our unit about Safety and the Changing Body will cover puberty, including emotional and physical changes. Later in the term, we will discuss transition to a new class or new school. Forest school later in half term.

French

We will study, 'Planning a French holiday' and learn to develop our conversational skills now that we know more French verbs



Computing

In Computing, the children will study Quizzing.

Science

We will complete the practical work lined to the Space Blankets topic.

RE

What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today? We will continue to explore key beliefs, prayer, charity and special places.



English

We will be reading Land of Roar by Jenny Mclachlan then exploring Myths/flashbacks, playscripts work and non-chronological reports. The children will continue to work hard with their weekly spellings and more focus will be put on the statutory words (see Seesaw)
